When survivors are forced to stay in the home or in close proximity to their abuser more frequently, an abuser can use any tool to exert control over their victim, including a national health concern such as COVID-19. In a time where companies may be encouraging that their employees work remotely, and the CDC is encouraging “social distancing,” an abuser may take advantage of an already stressful situation to gain more control. The highly-trained advocates at the National Domestic Violence Hotline are available 24/7/365 to talk confidentially with anyone experiencing IPV/DV, seeking resources or information, or questioning unhealthy aspects of their relationship.
