Barbara Allen commemorated today's date which would have been her son James's 50th birthday. He passed away at the age of 35 due to the disease of addiction. At that time, she was unaware of all the efforts undertaken to address behavioral health issues. Now as she travels the State, she hears that "nothing is being done." Barbara went on to say this is "not true," and thanked all for the work that is being done to promote behavioral health whether in a paid position or in advocacy. "What you do, matters".

THE DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Barbara J. Bazron, Ph.D., Deputy Secretary, Behavioral Health/Executive Director, Behavioral Health Administration

Dr. Bazron shared with the council the new organizational structure for the Maryland Department of Health (MDH). As of January 9, 2018, Robert Neall is the new Secretary of Health. He comes to us with a wealth of health care experience. The former Secretary, Dennis Schrader, is now the Chief Operating Officer as well as the Medicaid Director. This includes managing the Medicaid portfolio and all of the regulatory programs which includes all of the boards and commissions. The new organizational chart was provided to members.

In addition, an Enterprise Shared Services function and model has been developed which crosses all of the "Business Units". This will impact how we operate. This includes Finance, Budget & Capital, Human Resources, IT, Procurement and HCFA. Our administration remains the same.

Our first hearing in Annapolis is today and involves the work we are doing around Opioids.

We allocated 2 million dollars for a Substance Abuse Crisis Stabilization Center in Baltimore City, which will be administered by Tuerk House. This will be up and running by April and we will keep you posted on updates.

We have pushed to increase the number of persons with lived experience to be more involved in our system. They are called Peer Recovery Support Specialists. We have developed a common

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job description with a recommended salary that we hope will be used across the state to reduce confusion around their roles. When I started at BHA we had 102 Peer Support Recovery Specialists. We now have 226. We have Peers working in 10 hospital Emergency Departments and 5 more hospitals coming on board.

SAMSHA has indicated that they will fund year two of the CURES Act. We will be eligible for another 10 million dollars.

We are making major success in terms of our forensic bed capacity and ability to get individuals into beds sooner. Our cycle time (when we receive an order for placement to the time of placement) for all hospitals is just over 7 days -which is a major improvement.

Our Case Management system for the 8-507 process is moving along, which will give judges feedback to know where individuals are in the process. We have negotiated agreements with providers. A council member noted that rural areas have minimal to no 8-507 providers. The 8-507 process refers to individuals with substance use disorders who have been court ordered to treatment. Clay Stamp heads the State Opioid Operations Command Center (OOCC).

The Crisis Services' grant in Baltimore City includes the Baltimore City Crisis Response Center which will be involved in providing case management services to those discharging from the center.

We are also looking at developing a crisis walk- in center.

PRESENTATION – Behavioral Crisis at the Workplace - Richard Ortega, Ph.D., Office of Forensic Services, Behavioral Health Administration

Dr. Ortega discussed the importance of performing a risk analysis of your physical workspace, rehearsing a plan of action, allowing agitated individuals personal space, respecting fear, and supporting your co-workers. Remember the Three D's (Delay, Distract, Divert) the full power point is attached.
