## PRE-CHARGE CONSENT ORDER

On or about February 3, 2017, the Maryland State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists (the "Board") received a complaint alleging that the Respondent, Mercy Cruz, CAC-AD provided treatment and services to group therapy patients without a valid license, certification or trainee authorization to practice alcohol and drug counseling. Pursuant to the Maryland Professional Counselors and Therapists Act (the "Act"), codified at Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. II ("Health Occ.") §§ 17-101 et seq. (2014 Repl. Vol. & 2017 Supp.), the Board investigated the complaint. investigation found the following: (1) that on or about October 12, 2016, the Board issued a notification that the Respondent's alcohol drug trainee ("ADT") authorization would expire on November 30, 2016; (2) that on or about November 4, 2016, the Board received the Respondent's renewal application and Section 2, entitled "Documentation of Supervision" was left unanswered and Section 3, entitled "Documentation of Examination" was also blank; (3) that the application was not processed and administratively closed due to the Respondent's failure to submit a complete application which included the requirements for certification or licensure; (4) that the Respondent failed to renew her license before it expired; (5) that the Respondent only worked at

Facility A<sup>1</sup> as a Substance Abuse Counselor where she practiced substance abuse counseling; (6) that according to a wage report the Respondent's Maryland earnings at Facility A amounted to \$3697.00 for January 2017 through March 2017; and (7) that the Respondent was unlicensed when she resigned from employment at Facility A around January or February 2017 more than 30 days after her ADT authorization had expired; (8) that the Respondent was issued a certified associate alcohol and drug counselor license on or about September 21, 2018, which will expire on January 31, 2022. Based on the results of the investigation, the Board determined that the Respondent's failure to renew her license and practicing alcohol and drug counseling without a license was in violation of the Act. *Id.* Rather than issue formal charges against the Respondent, the Respondent and the Board agreed to enter into this pre-charge consent order.

## **ORDER**

Based on the foregoing, it is this 17th day of September , 2021, the Applicant and the Board agreed to enter into this Consent Order, which states:

**ORDERED** that from the effective date of the Consent Order, the Respondent shall pay a fine in the amount of \$600; and it is further

**ORDERED** that the said fine shall be paid within 90 days of the effective date of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED that if the Respondent fails to comply with the above stated conditions, the Respondent shall be immediately revoked, and given notice and an



opportunity for a post-deprivation show cause hearing. If, in its sole discretion, the Board determines that there is a genuine dispute as to a material fact, the hearing shall subsequently be an evidentiary hearing before the Board; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this Pre-Charge Consent Order shall be a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Gen. Prov. §§ 4-101 et seq. (2014).
