## Housing Support Services Policy Stakeholder Input Summary

Housing Support Services is one of the DDA-operated Waiver Program Support Services. This Waiver Program Service provides time-limited supports to assist a person to identify and navigate housing opportunities, address or overcome barriers to housing, and secure and retain their own home.

The Developmental Disability Administration (DDA) issued its proposed policy for Housing Support Services on July 14, 2023, requesting input from people, families, Coordination of Community Services agencies, community providers, and advocacy organizations. The Stakeholder input period ended on July 28, 2023. In total, 2 unduplicated stakeholders submitted input. Below is a summary of stakeholder recommendations and the DDA's responses.
