c. **Derivation of Estimates for Each Factor.** Provide a narrative description for the derivation of the estimates of the following factors.

i. **Factor D Derivation.** The estimates of Factor D for each waiver year are located in Item J-2-d. The basis for these estimates is as follows:

The estimated number of users for Factor D estimates for Waiver Years (WYs) 1-5 are based on analysis of CMS-372(S) reports and user enrollment in Community Support Waiver (CSW) services in FY22-FY23 from LTSSMaryland person-centered plan (PCP) data and FY22 Self-Directed participant service enrollment data. The FY22-FY23 LTSSMaryland data file includes services on approved service plans for participants receiving services in PCIS2 and LTSS and for those who are self-directing their services. The FY22 Self-Directed service data file includes service user data only for participants self-directing their services. In absence of consistent historical service utilization in the CSW CMS-372 (S), the estimated number of users for each service is calculated using the basis of the percentage of users in each service to the total users in the Community Support Waiver program using data from the FY22-FY23 LTSSMaryland person-centered plan data file and the FY22 Self-Directed services data file for self-directed specific services. Assuming the trend is the same throughout the length of the waiver renewal (FY24-FY28), these percentages are then applied to the Total Estimated Unduplicated Participants in Appendix B for each waiver year to get the estimated number of users for each service.

The percentages are as follows: Assistive Technology and Services – 2%; Behavioral Assessment and Behavioral Plan – 6%; Behavioral Consultation – 6.25%, Brief Support

As providers continue to transition their service billing from the PCIS2 system to LTSSMaryland, we estimate users of PCIS2 services in WYs 1-2 with all services estimated to be billed in LTSSMaryland in WYs 3-5. These estimates may be updated based on the LTSSMaryland transition plan and informed by the public health emergency unwinding timeline. Some of the same services in both systems are billed using different units of service, so estimated users have been included for both PCIS and LTSSMaryland services. PCIS2 hour unit services Family Peer and Mentoring Supports, Housing Support Services, and Respite Hourly are 15-minute unit services in LTSSMaryland and PCIS2 Day unit services Community Development Services, Day Habilitation, and Career Exploration services are 15-minute unit services in LTSSMaryland.

We estimate about half of the users remaining in PCIS2 services, from an FY22 PCIS2 service data file, to transition to billing the LTSSMaryland service in WY1 with most of the remaining users transitioning in WY2 and all remaining users having transitioned by WY3. The estimated number of users for each of these services is calculated using the basis of the percentage of users in each service to the total users in the Community Pathways Waiver program using data from the FY22-FY23 LTSSMaryland person-centered plan data file, and then applying the percentages to the Total Estimated Unduplicated Participants in Appendix B for each waiver year to get the estimated number of users for each service. For WYs 1-2, the estimated remaining PCIS2 service users are deducted from the estimated users for each LTSSMaryland service.

~~The number of slots for CSW were adjusted to increase the reserve capacity for Transitioning Youth. DDA analyzed the historical data which showed an increase in waiver enrollment and projected what would be needed to accommodate TY's in the future. This resulted in an increase in reserve capacity for TY's to 500 and an overall increase in slots of 250 for Yr3 and Yr4. Using the same approach, DDA adjusted the number of slots in Year 5 by 340.~~

~~The Factor D', G, and G' estimates were updated to realign the time period of the Waiver Years from a calendar year (1/18-12/18) to a fiscal year (7/19-6/20). To implement this change, the Waiver was renewed early to begin in FY20 so WY1 was FY20, WY2 was FY21, etc. The Community Pathways Waiver was renewed in FY19 so WY1 is FY19, WY2 is FY20 and WY3 is FY21.
