We have recently received several letters concerning regulatory requirements for emergency equipment in Ambulatory Surgical Centers (ASC). Currently, Medicare Conditions of Participation (42 CFR 416.44) require a ventilator. State licensure regulations also require a ventilator. The Office of Health Care Quality (OHCQ) has interpreted this to mean that an ASC that only provides local anesthesia would meet the requirement with a positive pressure oxygen regulator. Any ASC that provides general anesthesia must have an appropriately maintained and operating ventilator.

We have contacted the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA), and asked HCFA if this interpretation is consistent with federal policy. However, until we receive a determination from HCFA, OHCQ will continue to interpret the regulation as it has.
