We have recently received many inquiries concerning emergency equipment requirements for an ASC when conscious intravenous sedation or a combination of local anesthesia and conscious intravenous sedation is administered. In our January memorandum (transmittal M:00-001) we stated that an Ambulatory Surgical Center (ASC) that provides only local anesthesia would meet the emergency equipment requirements with a positive pressure oxygen regulator, and that an ASC that administers general anesthesia must have an appropriately maintained and operating ventilator. The Office of Health Care Quality does not categorize conscious intravenous sedation as "general" anesthesia. Therefore, an ASC that administers local anesthesia and/or conscious intravenous sedation would meet the requirement with a positive pressure oxygen regulator.
