

## ORDER OF MODIFICATION

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") is in receipt of a petition from McKinley Guess, Pharmacist License No. 10936, requesting modification of certain terms of probation set forth in the Board's Consent Order, dated August 30, 2012. The Consent Order placed Mr. Guess' pharmacist license on probation for a period of at least three (3) years based on substance abuse impairment. The Consent Order permits Mr. Guess to petition the Board for modification of the probationary terms after one (1) year. Mr. Guess is requesting that the Board discontinue his requirement to participate in 12 -step meetings, reduce the frequency of his urine screenings, and reduce the frequency of employer performance reports. Upon consideration of Mr. Guess' petition and his full compliance with the probationary terms to date, the Board voted to modify the terms of probation as ordered below.

## ORDER

It is this $4^{2}$ day of mece 2014, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby,

ORDERED that probationary terms contained in the Consent Order, dated August 30, 2012, be modified as follows:

## PROBATIONARY TERM NO. 1

Mr. Guess shall ensure that his pharmacist supervisor submits employee performance reports to the Board every six (6) months; and be it further,

## PROBATIONARY TERM NO. 4

Mr . Guess shall submit to random, Board-ordered urine screens once a month; and be it further,

ORDERED that all other terms of the August 30, 2012, Consent Order remain in full force and effect; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Maryland Annotated Code, State Government Article, Section 10-617(h).
