



FINDINGS OF FACT

From the admissions of Mr. Hall and from the uncontested evidence produced the Board found that Mr. Hall took drugs without authorization and for his personal use during his employment at Revco Drug Stores Numbers 1102 and 1211, and that during his employment at Westernport Store in July, 1980, Mr. Hall was unable to competently perform his duties as a pharmacist due to alcohol and drug consumption, as specifically set forth in the Agreed Statement of Facts submitted to the Board. Mr. Hall acknowledged he is an alcoholic and does not presently consider pharmacy practice possible for at least a year.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

From the foregoing findings of fact, the Board made the following conclusion of law:


Upon the foregoing findings of fact, the Board adjudicates the Respondent guilty of the charges placed, to wit:

- (iii) Fraudulent or deceitful procurement or use of a pharmacist's certificate of renewal;
- (vii) Dispensing or sale of any drug for which a prescription is required without first having received from an authorized prescriber a written or oral prescription for the drug;
- (xii) Addiction to controlled dangerous substances, habitual drunkenness, or rendering of professional services when intoxicated or under the influence of drugs with abuse potential;
- (xvi) Professional, physical, or mental incompetence.

ORDER

.. .. . -5 .. . and conclusions of

ORDERED that the license to practice pharmacy in the State of Maryland heretofore issued to Respondent by the Board is hereby indefinitely SUSPENDED, subject to possible reinstatement by petition, such petition to be entertained no sooner than the expiration of one year from the date of this Order.

AGREED STATEMENT OF FACTS

Dwight Hall, R.Ph. and Susan K. Gauvey, Assistant Attorney General and Administrative Prosecutor for the Board of Pharmacy, have agreed to enter into the following statement of facts.

1. Dwight Hall, R.Ph. is licensed to practice pharmacy in the State of Maryland.
2. Mr. Hall was employed as a relief pharmacist for Revco Drug Store, Inc. from May 20, 1980 until July 25, 1980.
3. During his employment at the Revco Drug Store #1102, Oakland, Maryland, from May 20, 1980 through July 25, 1980, Mr. Hall took without authorization and for his personal use 100 Ritalin, 10 mg. and 50 Dexedrine Spansules, 15 mg.
4. During his employment at the Revco Drug Store #1211, Westernport, Maryland in July, 1980, Mr. Hall took without authorization and for his personal use 5 Demerol, 100 mg., 24 Tuinal, 100 mg., 391 Ritalin, 10 mg., 155 Percodan, 127 Ritalin, 20 mg. and 94 Seconal, 100 mg.
5. During his employment at the Westernport store in July, 1980, Mr. Hall was unable to competently perform his duties as a pharmacist because of consumption of alcohol and the above-mentioned drugs while on duty.

6. Mr. Hall was subsequently terminated by Phil Kardon,  
Pharmacy Supervisor, for Revco Drug Stores, Inc. on July 25,  
1980.
