#### FINAL ORDER OF REVOCATION OF PHARMACY TECHNICIAN REGISTRATION

The Maryland State Board of Pharmacy ("the Board") hereby notifies Shaneek Pickney ("the Respondent"), Registration Number: T07475, of the Board's intent to revoke her registration to practice as pharmacy technician under the Maryland Pharmacy Act (the "Act"), Md. Health Occ. Code Ann. ("H.O.") §§ 12-101et seq. (2014 Repl. Vol.). The pertinent provisions state:

# H. O. § 12-6B-09. Grounds for reprimand or denial, probation, suspension or revocation of registration.

Subject to the hearing provision of § 12-315 of this title, the Board may deny a pharmacy technician's registration to any applicant, reprimand a registered pharmacy technician, place any pharmacy technician's registration on probation, or suspend or revoke a pharmacy technician's registration if the applicant or pharmacy technician registrant:

- (3) Fraudulently uses a pharmacy technician's registration [and]
- (27) Participates in any activity that is grounds for Board action under § 12-313or § 12-409 of this title[.]

## H.O. § 12-313. Denials, reprimands, suspensions, and revocations.

(b) In general. - Subject to the hearing provisions of § 12-315 of this subtitle, the Board, on the affirmative vote of a majority of its members then serving, may deny a license to any applicant for a pharmacist's license, reprimand any

licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license of a pharmacist if the applicant or licensee:

(25) Violates any rule or regulation adopted by the Board;

Code of Md. Regs.10. 34.10.

- .01 Patient Safety and Welfare.
  - B. A pharmacist may not:
  - (3) Engage in unprofessional conduct.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds:

- At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent was registered to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of Maryland.
- 2. The Respondent was originally registered to practice as a pharmacy technician in Maryland on or about June 8, 2010.
  - 3. The Respondent's registration expired on September 30, 2017.
- 4. At all times relevant hereto, Respondent worked as a pharmacy technician at a pharmacy ("Pharmacy A"), a national retail chain, located in Maryland.<sup>1</sup>
- 5. On or about June 22, 2017, a Pharmacy A pharmacy manager informed the Board of pilferage of controlled dangerous substances at Pharmacy A.
- An investigation conducted by Pharmacy A loss prevention employees revealed that the Respondent stole 300 tablets of Alprazolam 2mg and Suboxone 8 mg-2 mg SL FILM. <sup>2</sup>

- 7. During an interview with Pharmacy A loss prevention employees, the Respondent admitted that she stole Alprazolam and Suboxone from Pharmacy A.
- 8. The facts, as set forth above, constitute a violation of H.O § 12-6B-06 (3) and (27), H.O § 12-313(b) (25), and Code of Md. Regs. 10.34.10.01B (3) and are grounds for the revocation of the Respondent's registration.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that the Respondent violated H.O. § 12-6B- 09 (3) and (27), H.O § 12-313(b) (25), and Code Md. Regs.10.34.10.01B (3).

#### **ORDER**

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is this day of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ 2018, a majority of the quorum of the Board, hereby

ORDERED that the Respondent 's registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of Maryland is hereby REVOKED and the Board will not accept, from the Respondent, any future application for licensure, certification, and/or registration; and it is further

**ORDERED** that Respondent shall return to the Board all Maryland pharmacy technician registrations within ten (10) days of the date of this Order; and it is further.

ORDERED that the effective date of this Order is the date that it is signed by the Board; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this Order is final and a public document pursuant to Md. General Provisions §§ 4-104 *et seq.* (2014).
