SECOND ORDER OF MODIFICATION

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy is in receipt of a request from Philip Price, License No. 11157, requesting further modification of certain terms of probation as set forth in the Pre-Charge Consent Order, dated January 23, 2009, and modified on March 2, 2010. Mr. Price is also on probation pursuant to a Consent Agreement in South Carolina, where he currently resides. The Maryland Consent Order is intended to mirror the substantive terms of the South Carolina Order. Specifically, Mr. Price requests revising the random urinalysis requirement to once a month plus at least one additional random urine screen per year, from the current requirement of "an average of twice a month", in order to conform to the revised terms of the South Carolina Order. Upon consideration of Mr. Price's request, the Board voted to modify the terms of probation as ordered below.

ORDER

It is this <u>Joyle</u> day of <u>Septe</u>, 2010, by an affirmative vote of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, hereby,

ORDERED that Pre-Charge Consent Order, dated January 23, 2009, be modified as follows:

Probationary Condition #3 shall require: "Mr. Price shall be subject to random urine screenings by the RPP an average of once a month with at least one additional urine screen per year"; and be it further,

ORDERED that all of the other terms of the January 23, 2009, Consent Order remain in

full force and effect; and be it further,

ORDERED that the original Order of Modification, dated March 2, 2010, is hereby superseded by this Second Order of Modification; and be it further,

ORDERED that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Maryland Annotated Code, State Government Article, Section 10-617(h).
