

Proclamation

From the Governor of the State of Maryland

COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH **MARCH 2009**

WHEREAS, Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths in Maryland; the American Cancer Society projected approximately 2,920 new cases and 940 deaths in 2008 due to the disease in the state; and

WHEREAS. Screening of cororectal cancer is recommended for people age 50 years and over and earlier than age 50 for people with personal or family risk factors; that signs or symptoms of colorectal cancer are often absent in early stages but may include bleeding from the rectum, blood in the stool, abdominal mass or pain, and change in bowel movements; and

Maryland is among the top five states nationally where the proportion of the population age 50 and over has WHEREAS, had a recent screening for colorectal cancer; and

The Maryland Cigarette Restitution Fund Program through state and local public health programs provides WHEREAS, colorectal cancer screening for eligible individuals at no cost in order to decrease colorectal cancer mortality and reduce the racial and ethnic disparities in cancer mortality in Maryland; and

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and its local public health programs urge health WHEREAS, care providers to recommend colorectal screening for their eligible clients and urge the public to seek screening.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARTIN O'MALLEY, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, do hereby proclaim MARCH 2009, as COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH in Maryland, and do commend this observance to all of our citizens.
