Reporting of Environmental Issues Related to Weather Events

During a severe weather event, facilities may experience a loss of power or other emergency related issues. It is expected that all providers have emergency plans in place to accommodate any potential disruptions to facilities as a result of the event.

These plans must include immediate notification to the Local Health Department (LHD) in your specific jurisdiction of any issues that may be occurring within your facilities, or in the case of dialysis providers, to the Office of Health Care Quality (OHCQ). Types of issues could include, but are not limited to, the failure of cooling or heating systems, power outages, water outages, flooding or other conditions that could impact the health, safety, and/or well-being of your residents or the operation of your facility. Should non-dialysis providers experience a problem during business hours or non- business hours, please call the numbers provided by your LHD. For dialysis providers, please contact OHCQ during business hours at 410-402-8015. The number to call after normal business hours is 410-402-8280.

For hospitals, contact your local Emergency Management Agency or Local Health Department for immediate assistance. If you have difficulties contacting them through your normal methods, please contact EMRC through your ED Console or by calling 800-648-3001.

Failure to exercise prompt notification may result in sanctions and disciplinary action from the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.
