# Review and Approval of May 7, 2019 Executive Committee Meeting Minutes

#### **Discussion of RHC Member Nominations**

- RHC Executive Committee members discussed nominations received for appointments to the RHC. Nominations were considered for four seats that are currently vacant (primary care provider who practices in the Mid-Shore Region; health care provider from Caroline County; health care provider from Dorchester County; and representative from a primary transportation provider in the Mid-Shore Region) and three seats filled by members whose terms end in January 2020 (health care consumer from Dorchester County; health care consumer from Kent County; and representative from a local Board of Education in the Mid-Shore Region).
- The RHC Executive Committee made its nominations for all seats except for health care provider from Dorchester County, for which no nominations were received. Individuals nominated will be contacted to confirm their willingness to serve, and nominations will be submitted to the Secretary of Health for consideration.

## **Discussion of Draft Rural Health Complex Components**

 RHC Executive Committee members discussed a draft list of components for a rural health complex. This list pulls together items that have been discussed in RHC and individual county

- meetings and offers a preliminary attempt to delineate the key components that need to be present for a rural health complex.
- The draft list of components for a rural health complex was developed within the context of serving the Medicare population. A question of whether to continue this focus for the initial model, with the understanding of broadening it in the future, or to broaden the focus to the entire population now will be discussed with the RHC at its December 2019 meeting.
- The Integrating Clinical and Social Support Services Workgroup will work on refining the draft list of components for a rural health complex.
