CALL TO ORDER AND ESTABLISHMENT OF A QUORUM

Mr. Ingegno called the meeting to order at 1:00 PM.

APPROVAL OF SEPTEMBER 11, 2018 MINUTES

Ms. Hongsermeier moved to approve the Minutes as written and Dr. Marinakis seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved the motion.

1. OLD BUSINESS

A. SCOPE OF PRACTICE

Dr. Ingegno tabled this matter indefinitely.

B. CLEAN UP BILL

Ms. Heisler stated the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) has put the Board's clean up bill in a placeholder's position and has not been informed whether the Department intends to include it in its 2019 legislative package. She has written to MDH to request special consideration. The Board decided to find its own sponsor if needed. Lillian Reese said that the Department should have an update by early December.

C. DRY NEEDLING

Ms. Heisler stated that the public is now able to check the dry needling registration status of a physical therapist on the Physical Therapy Board's website. It can be found under

the license verification page. If a physical therapist is registered to practice dry needling, a notation of a specialty in dry needling will show next to the licensee's information. If the specialty status is not there, the physical therapist is not registered.

Mr. Blaiwas said that page 4 of the Physical Therapy Board's dry needling application has conflicting information. The first sentence on page 4 says that the physical therapist must have 40 hours of hands on instruction and in the attestation it says that they must have 40 hours of experience. Ms. Heisler will contact the PT Board with this conflict and ask that it be corrected to reflect 40 hours of hands on instruction in both sentences.

3. NEW BUSINESS

A. CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS

Ms. Heisler stated that federal law mandates that any health care provider who receives federal funds and is applying for a license must undergo a criminal background check. The Department is contemplating whether to do an omnibus bill to mandate this for all Maryland health care providers. She will keep the Board updated.
