- 1. Ms. Banks called the meeting to order at 9:05 am.
- 2. Ms. Banks asked for approval of May General Session Agenda. Ms. Murray asked the announcement involving the June Board Meeting be removed from the agenda. Ms. Quirk made a motion to approve with revisions. Ms. Smith seconded it. All were in favor.
- 3. Ms. Banks asked for approval of April General Session Minutes. Ms. Quirk made a motion. Ms. Pierre seconded it. All were in favor.
- 4. Ms. Banks asked for approval of ratification of 13 OTs and 5 OTAs from April's Executive Session. Ms. Pierre made a motion. Ms. Quirk seconded it. All were in favor.

#### a. Renewals

- a. As of Thursday night, 492 OTs and 89 OTAs have renewed.
- b. Fingerprinting is still required for renewals if the Board does not already have a set from a former application.
  - i. Ms. Banks said that many fingerprinting sites are still open.

- 1. Inquiry from May 5, 2020: Former licensee wants to know how to complete in-person hours and canceled coursework during the COVID-19 crisis,
  - a. Ms. Murray heard that webinar courses are considered in-person.
  - b. Ms. Banks thinks that those courses should be fine and teletherapy should be fine.
    - i. Ms. Brogan agreed.
  - c. Ms. Quirk asked if all of the courses can be done online.
    - i. Mr. Martin said that yes, they can be done online.

- ii. Ms. Hagaa said that some Boards have regulations regarding in-person courses, but we do not have regulations regarding this.
- iii. Ms. Murray will send out a bulletin about this.
- 2. Inquiry from May 8, 2020: OT student could not finish level II fieldwork and wants to know if he should apply to be an OTA instead.
  - a. Ms. Smith said that this goes to NBCOT. She should be able to take the exam soon and may want to apply for a temporary license.
  - b. The Board is confused as to how she has graduated without the completion of the fieldwork. Ms. Murray will send an email.
  - c. Ms. Smith said it is not possible to take the COTA exam.
- 3. Inquiry from April 30, 2020: An agency is asking an OT to perform teletherapy on a DC student residing in Maryland but is asking her to be trained on DC in-processing and documentation.
  - a. Ms. Banks said that she can practice on the child if she is in Maryland. However, the Board cannot opine on what she should do about the training and documentation.
  - b. Ms. Murray will suggest that she reach out to the DC OT Board.
- 4. Inquiry from April 28, 2020: What are the requirements to use diathermy?
  - a. Mr. Martin said that it is an electromagnetic modality. There is not a specific set of educational requirements, but she must be properly trained before using it. Mr. Martin also suggested shadowing.
- 5. Inquiry from April 24, 2020: Can an OT supervise a home health aide?
  - a. Mr. Martin and Ms. Banks said that the "aide" in regulations does not refer to home health aides.
  - b. Ms. Murray will refer them to the list in the regulations.
- 6. Inquiry from April 23, 2020: Can an out of state licensee do telehealth consultation to a Maryland resident?
  - a. Ms. Banks said that they still need to be licensed in Maryland.
