CONSENT ORDER

On February 21, 2007, the Maryland State Board of Dental Examiners (the "Board") charged SUZANNE H. KIM, D.D.S. ("Respondent"), date of birth: 1/30/60, license number: 11372, under the Maryland Dentistry Act, Md. Health Occ. ("H.O.") Code Ann. §§ 4-101 et seq. (2005 & Supp. 2006) for violations of § 4-315(a). The pertinent provisions of H.O. § 4-315(a) and those under which the charges were brought, are as follows:

- (a) License to practice dentistry. -- Subject to the hearing provisions of § 4-318 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a general license to practice dentistry...reprimand any licensed dentist, place any licensed dentist on probation, or suspend or revoke the license of any licensed dentist, if the...licensee:
 - (6) Practices dentistry in a professionally incompetent manner or in grossly incompetent manner;
 - (16) Behaves dishonorably or unprofessionally, or violates a professional code of ethics pertaining to the dentistry profession; and
 - (28) Except in an emergency life-threatening situation where it is not feasible or practicable, fails to comply with the Centers for Disease Control's guidelines on universal precautions.

As a result of improvements in her practice, and as a result of negotiations with the Office of the Attorney General, by Kimberly S. Cammarata, Assistant Attorney General, the Respondent, by D. Elizabeth Walker, Esquire and John Murphy, Esquire and the Board, the parties agreed to enter into this Consent Order, consisting of Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, and with the terms and conditions set forth herein.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Respondent is, and at all times relevant to the charges, was licensed to practice dentistry in the State of Maryland, initially receiving her license on May 16, 1994.
- 2. On or about August 28, 2006, the Board received a complaint from a patient of the Respondent alleging unprofessional conduct of the Respondent and allegations, which if true would be violations of infection control guidelines. The Board referred the complaint to its investigative unit.
- 3. On or about October 12, 2006, Board investigators conducted an unannounced inspection of the Respondent's office to observe infection control practices of the office. As part of the inspection the Respondent was asked to provide evidence that the autoclave is spore tested on a weekly basis. The Respondent advised that she had not spore tested her autoclave in approximately two years. Records revealed that the autoclave was last spore tested in June of 2001.
- 4. The investigators also noted that heavy duty gloves were not available in the office for cleaning of the operatory or scrubbing of instruments. They observed the dental assistant clean the operatory wearing regular latex gloves wearing a short sleeved lab coat. She also hand-scrubbed contaminated instruments wearing regular latex gloves.

5. The bio-hazardous waste bin was directly next to the regular waste bin which could easily result in cross-contamination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board finds that the Respondent violated H.O. § 4-315(a)(6), (16) and (28) which provide:

- (6) Practices dentistry in a professionally incompetent manner or in a grossly incompetent manner;
- (16) Behaves dishonorably or unprofessionally, or violates a professional code of ethics pertaining to the dentistry profession; and
- (28) Except in an emergency life-threatening situation where it is not feasible or practicable, fails to comply with the Centers for Disease Control's guidelines on universal precautions.

ORDER

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is by the Maryland State Board of Dental Examiners, hereby:

ORDERED that the Respondent is REPRIMANDED; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent shall be subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The Respondent shall have a Board-approved CDC consultant conduct one (1) unannounced CDC inspection of the Respondent's office within one (1) year from the date of this Consent Order. The inspector shall provide a report to the Board regarding the findings within ten (10) days of the inspection.
- 2. The Respondent shall be subject to random, unannounced inspections by the Board or its representative(s) at any time during the duration of this Consent Order.

3. A finding by the Board indicating that the Respondent or her practice is not in compliance with the CDC guidelines shall constitute a violation of this Order and may, in the Board's discretion, be grounds for charging the Respondent under the Act or for immediately suspending the Respondent's license. In the event that the Respondent's license is suspended under this provision, she shall be afforded a Show Cause Hearing before the Board to show cause as to why her license should not be suspended or should not have been suspended; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent shall at all times cooperate with the Board and any of its agents or employees in the monitoring, supervision and investigation of the Respondent's compliance with the terms and conditions of this Consent Order, and it is further

ORDERED that one (1) year from the effective date of this Order, the Respondent may petition the Board for termination of the Order. If the Respondent has satisfactorily complied with all conditions of the Order, and there are no outstanding complaints regarding the Respondent, the Board may terminate the Order; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent shall be responsible for all costs incurred under this Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that this Consent Order is PUBLIC DOCUMENT as defined in Md. State Gov't Code Ann. §§ 10-611 et seq. (2004).

- I sign this Consent Order without reservation as my voluntary act and deed. I 6. acknowledge that I fully understand and comprehend the language, meaning, and terms of this Consent Order.
