Content of Grant Application

- 1. Cover sheet
- 2. Project summary (one page)
- 3. Goals of the project, the problem addressed, target population, service area, how project will ameliorate the problem, precedent for project, anticipated outcomes
- 4. Measurable project objectives



Content of Grant Application (cont.)

- 5. Work plan for accomplishing project objectives, including milestones and deliverables
- 6. Methodology for evaluating project "success"
- 7. Project timeline
- Project director and key personnel: responsibilities and why uniquely qualified (attach resumes)



Content of Grant Application (cont.):

- 9. Plan for sustaining project after grant
- 10. Co-funding/matching support
- 11. Institutional partners and letters of commitment
- 12. Background on applicant organization and why qualified to apply/carry out project



Content of Grant Application (cont.):

- 13. Project budget (include all sources of funds)
- 14. Project budget narrative
- 15. Institutional budget for project years
- 16. Audited financial statements (most recent two years)
- 17. Form 990 (most recent year)

Scoring Applications

Suggested Scoring Criteria:

- 1. Clarity of project goals, methods, and outcomes; complies with legislative intent
- 2. Appropriateness of the proposed budget and project timeline
- 3. Ability to collect relevant data and use it to manage and evaluate the project



Scoring Applications

Suggested Scoring Criteria (cont.)

- 4. Financial accountability and viability of applicant institution
- 5. Uniqueness of proposed project and prospects for success
- 6. Potential impact on low-income and underand uninsured individuals
- 7. Community need and readiness



Scoring of Applications

Suggested Scoring Criteria (cont.)

- 7. Involvement of appropriate stakeholders and community partners
- 8. Demonstrated institutional commitment to improving access to care
- 9. Prospects for sustainability
- 10. Geographic balance across the state
