MARYLAND COMMISSION ON KIDNEY DISEASE OPEN SESSION MEETING MINUTES

Thursday October 27, 2005 4201 Patterson Avenue, Room 108-109

The Open Session meeting of the Commission on Kidney Disease was held on Thursday, October 27, 2005 in Room 109, 4201 Patterson Avenue. The Chairman, Dr. Jeffrey Fink, called the meeting to order at 2:15 PM. Commission members present were: Drs. I. APPROVAL OF JULY 28, 2005 MINUTES

The Commission approved the Open Session minutes as submitted.

II. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Transplant Committee

Dr. Fink reported that the transplant sub-committee is working on developing policies for directing the approach to surveying the transplant centers in the State.

Dr. Fink discussed the importance of emergency and disaster preparedness in the wake of Hurricane Katrina and the many hurricanes experienced this year. He noted that the dialysis patients are particularly vulnerable when these natural disasters occur.

III. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mrs. Schwartz welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced Anne-Marie Gregory who has been appointed to the Commission by the Governor in the newly legislated category of *Renal Social Worker*. Ms. Gregory was nominated by the Maryland Chapter of the CNSW. Mrs. Schwartz informed the group that Dr. Luis Giminez has also been appointed, representing the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. She noted that the Commission still has a vacant consumer position. She requested that anyone interested in serving on the Commission should forward their name and CV to the Commission office.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

Social Work Task Force Update

Social Work Guidelines
 Mrs. Adcock informed the group that

Mrs. Adcock informed the group that the social work guidelines were distributed to the renal community on September 8th. These guidelines were developed in response to the renal social workers' concerns regarding equitable social services in the renal community.

Mrs. Adcock directed everyone's attention to the Commission's proposed regulations addressing the social work services in the dialysis facility. The proposed changes to the existing regulations include the setting of standards for monitoring individuals in a freestanding dialysis facility, and the minimal standards for renal social work responsibilities.

The Commission voted in favor of approving the proposed regulations. Dr. Einhorn noted that when in effect, these proposed regulations would provide a mechanism by which to verify via a survey social services provided in the facilities. These proposed regulations would set minimal social work standards in the State.

Mrs. Schwartz noted that the Commission is autonomous in promulgating regulations. The AELR will review the proposed regulations, whereupon they will be published in the Maryland Register with an opportunity for a comment period.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Kidney Disease Program- Statistics and Budget

Ms. Manning presented and discussed the KDP Budget, Statistics, and Expenditure Reports.

B. Medicare Part D

Ms. Nowakowski reported that 2000 people to date have been added to the Medicaid roles since Hurricane Katrina. She added that these victims of the hurricane would be granted 5 months of services. The State may be reimbursed by the Federal government for the incurred costs.

Ms. Nowakowski discussed the impact of Medicare Part D on KDP recipients. The Department will strongly urge them to join Medicare Part D and will be sending a letter in the mail to the recipients. She emphasized that there might be future penalties assessed to those who do not enroll in the near future. She reviewed the benefits of Medicare Part D, which covers more medications than the KDP formulary, which covers only renal related drugs.

Mrs. Mooney and Ms. Gregory inquired whether the Department would issue Letters of Credible Coverage from the KDP, thus exempting the KDP recipients from enrolling into Medicare Part D at this time. Ms. Nowakowski stated she would check into this request, but currently there were no plans to issues these letters. Ms. Manning noted that because the KDP formulary is so limited they might not be able to issue them.

C. Criteria for Early Termination of Treatment

Mrs. Schwarz asked the group about their facilities' policies regarding early termination of patient treatments. She noted that the Commission has received calls from angry patients because they are having difficulty at their respective facility, when they are requesting early termination of dialysis, and are being denied. A discussion ensued, and the Commissioners agreed that patients have the right to request to have their treatment terminated early. Facilities should have protocols for early treatment termination, and patient education and staff training are essential to effectively deal with these requests.

D. Facility Licenses

Mrs. Adcock reported that she has noted on several surveys that the facility's license has been incorrect. The licenses may list the incorrect number of chairs or services provided. Mrs. Fagan reviewed the licensure process and noted that it is important that the facilities fill out their applications correctly and notify the OHCQ if their facility license is not correct.

E. Disaster Plans

Mrs. Adcock introduced emergency personal medical information form from the CDC and a sample of the vial of life information from Verizon. She encouraged facilities to discuss with the patients the importance of keeping copies of their medical information in the event of an emergency.

F. TB Testing in Dialysis Facilities

Mrs. Adcock referred the Commissioners to an article regarding TB in hemodialyssis patients. She noted that the patients are particularly vulnerable to the disease, thus the importance of patient and staff testing.

G. COMAR 10.07.01- Hospital and Special Hospital Proposed Patient Discharge Regulations

Mrs. Schwarz noted that these regulations have been promulgated and are open to public comment. They address appropriate discharge planning in acute care settings, which is particularly important for renal patients.

H. 2006 Commission Meeting Dates

Mrs. Schwartz announced that the tentative meeting dates for Commission meetings in 2006 are January 26, April 27, July 27 and October 26. She requested that the Commissioners notify her if there are any schedule conflicts.
