

It is against the law to sell any tobacco product to those under 21 years old. This includes:

- Cigarettes
- Cigars, Cigarillos, Little Cigars, including flavored products
- Electronic Smoking Devices (ESDs) including E-cigarettes, E-hookah, E-cigars, Vape pens, JUUL®, Puff Bars, BIDI Stick, etc.
- Smokeless Tobacco (Chew, Spit Tobacco, Dip, Snuff, etc.)
- Loose Tobacco and shisha (for pipes and hookah)
- "Loosies" cigarettes sold as individuals or less than a pack of 20 cigarettes
- Tobacco accessories such as filters, rolling papers, pipes, hookah, and liquids used in ESDs, *regardless of nicotine content*

As of February 10, 2020, the Maryland Comptroller's Field Enforcement Division issued a directive to prioritize enforcement actions against unauthorized products most widely used by youth - specifically, cartridgebased and disposable ESDs with flavors other than tobacco or menthol. Retailer licenses to sell tobacco and ESD products in Maryland may be subject to disciplinary action if the directives are not followed, as these products are being sold and marketed in direct violation of federal law.

If you are unsure a product can be legally sold – **don't sell!** There are no laws that require you to sell a product; however, there are restrictions placed on what you can sell and to whom.
