Minutes Organized by Agenda Items

I. Welcome and General Announcements

Renee Webster, OHCQ Assistant Director, called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. and welcomed the committee members and others in attendance.

Ms. Webster introduced Angela Bruno, an intern at OHCQ from the University of Maryland-Baltimore.

II. ASCLD/LAB and ANAB Merger Updates

Anja Einseln updated FLAC on the current status of the ASCLD/LAB and ANAB merger. The draft accreditation requirements were released for public comment in November 2016 and comments have been reviewed by an internal committee. A second draft of requirements was presented within the organization and additional areas requiring clarification were identified. Ms. Einseln could not provide FLAC with a specific launch date at this time. She did state that an implementation date will occur a few months after the official launch date and specific timelines will be customized depending on the customer. At this time, all current accreditation certificates will continue "as is", ANAB Legacy and ASCLD/LAB-International will be sun-setting at some point in the future.

III. Letter of Exception Criteria

Angela Bruno, OHCQ Intern, presented FLAC with her research on Letter of Exception criteria. Ms. Bruno informed the committee of similar efforts in other states regarding the qualifications necessary to obtain a Letter of Exception. She will continue her research focusing on the specific challenges that the county and municipal labs in Maryland are facing with the current regulations dealing with Letter of Exception. Ms. Bruno intends to form a workgroup in the near future to discuss competency and experience requirements for Letter of Exception applicants.

IV. 2017 Legislative Session

Lori Dodson updated FLAC on bills introduced in the House and Senate for the 2017 Legislative session that may impact the forensic community. Additional bills (HB429, HB647, HB1141, HB260, and SB734) were identified by committee members.
