





New HIV Diagnoses in Maryland

In 2020, there were 520 reported HIV diagnoses among NH-Black people.

- In 2020, NH-Black people accounted for 71.8% of the 724 reported HIV diagnoses.
- It is estimated that an additional 9.6% of NH-Black people living with HIV in Maryland remain undiagnosed, as of 2019.





 Diagnosis rates (per 100,000) among newly reported HIV diagnoses in 2020 remain highest among NH-Black people (33.9) as compared to NH-White people (3.3).



Characteristics of Black People Living with HIV in Maryland

At the end of 2020, there were 23,554 NH-Black people living with diagnosed HIV.

- 1 in 65 NH-Black persons were reported to be living with HIV in 2020.
- Rates (per 100,000) of HIV were twice as high among NH-Black males (2,084.1) as compared to NH-Black females (1,074.4). In other words, 1 in 47 NH-Black males and 1 in 93 NH-Black females were reported to be living with HIV.
