


HIV AND MALE-TO-MALE SEXUAL CONTACT IN MARYLAND, 2020

New HIV Diagnoses in Maryland


In 2020, there were 388 reported HIV diagnoses among persons with MSM exposure.

- Of the 724 reported HIV diagnoses in 2020, 53.6% were attributed to MSM, and 0.9% were among MSM/IDU.
- Of the 531 male HIV diagnoses in 2020, 73.1% were attributed to MSM and 1.2% to MSM/IDU.
- It is estimated that an additional 12.4% of persons with MSM exposure living with HIV in Maryland remain undiagnosed, as of 2019.



Characteristics of Marylanders with MSM Exposure Living with HIV

At the end of 2020, there were 12,768 people living with diagnosed HIV with MSM exposure.



- Of the 31,676 people living with diagnosed HIV in 2020, 40.3% were attributed to MSM exposure and 3.5% to MSM/IDU.
- MSM exposure was highest among individuals in their 30's (29.4%) and among NH-Black people (64.4%).
- Of the people living with diagnosed HIV attributed to MSM exposure, 74.6% had a viral load test result reported in 2020. Of those with a reported viral load test, 90.3% had a suppressed viral load.
