HIV among White People in Maryland, 2020

Data Reported through June 30, 2021

New HIV Diagnoses in Maryland
In 2020, there were 87 reported HIV diagnoses among NH-White people.

- In 2020, NH-White people accounted for 12.0\% of the 724 reported HIV diagnoses.
- It is estimated that an additional 9.7\% of NHWhite people living with HIV in Maryland remain undiagnosed, as of 2019.


- Diagnosis rates (per 100,000 ) among newly reported HIV diagnoses in 2020 remain highest among NH-Black people (33.9) as compared to NH-White people (3.3).


## Characteristics of White People Living with HIV in Maryland

At the end of 2020, there were 3,879 NH-White people living with diagnosed HIV.

- 1 in $675 \mathrm{NH}-$ White persons were reported to be living with HIV in 2020.
- Rates (per 100,000 ) of HIV were over four times higher among NH-White males (244.8) as compared to NH-White females (56.7). In other words, 1 in 408 NH -White males and 1 in $1,763 \mathrm{NH}$-White females were reported to be living with HIV.
