## **Rectal/Anal Atresia Fact Sheet**

#### What is Rectal/Anal Atresia?

• It is the absence or closure of the rectum (end of intestine where stool is held) or anus (opening for stool)

#### What is the cause of Rectal/Anal Atresia?

• The defect is caused by abnormal development of the fetus and there are many forms of rectal/ anal atresia that are associated with other birth defects

#### **Signs and Symptoms**

- Missing anal opening or anal opening ending in blind pouch
- Inability to pass stool within the first 24-48 hours after birth

#### Is there any treatment for Anal Rectal Atresia?

• Surgery is needed to reconnect the rectum and anus
